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<u>AB 361 (9/2021-1/2024)</u>

- State-proclaimed emergency + determination of imminent risks to attendees' health or safety
- Members can participate from any location (do not have to be within the jurisdictional boundaries of the District)
- Teleconferenced location does not need to be accessible to the public
- Do not need to identify each site members are teleconferencing from
- Do not need to post agenda to each teleconference site

 Re-authorize meeting by teleconference for meetings that occur more than 30 days apart

Teleconferencing Update

- Governor's October 17, 2022 Press Release
 - COVID-19 State of Emergency will end 2/28/2023
- AB 361 will no longer be available
- AB 2449 will start 1/1/2023
 - Requires at least a quorum of the board meeting at physical location
 - Teleconferencing member must publicly excuse his/her absence by disclosing "just cause" or "emergency circumstances"
 - "Just cause" cannot occur more than twice a year

 The March 20, 2023 Board meeting will be held in-person, and staff will work to secure a facility that offers a hybrid option. Staff recommend that the Board

1) find that, as a result of the COVID-19 emergency, meeting in person would present imminent risks to health and safety of attendees, AND

2) hold meetings by teleconference as authorized by § 54953 of Government Code.

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


E.O. N-7-22 Well Permitting Update

- Paragraph 9 requires GSA's to review well permits and provide written verification that permit is consistent with GSP
- Since May 6, 2022 Special Board meeting continue to work with Yolo County's Environmental Health Division – developed questionnaire as part of the process

As of January 18, 2023 and since April 1, 2022

- 54 relevant well permit applications
 - Replacement well permits = 17
 - New well permits = 37
 - 4 received YSGA written verification
 - 5 still need to submit a completed questionnaire
 - 28 pending review
